

A YEAR, ALMOST, IN REVIEW

Although 2024 isn't quite over, it's a good time to think back over this past year and

what we've accomplished as a church family. In many ways we continue to "hit on all cylinders", following established patterns of effective ministry. Our worship services continue to be Christ focused and inspirational. Our Food Pantry continues to serve from 1100 to 1300 people each month with a solid and diverse volunteer base. The Children's Learning Center continues to run at capacity with a waiting list. Our ministries to children and youth continue to grow as Lauren and Brenda complete their first full year as staff members.

We began the year 2024 looking at a large project that no one wanted to do but needed to be done: replacing almost all the roofs on our buildings. They were over 10 years old and the last hailstorm that passed through Midland had damaged them. That project has been completed and we're hopeful that not only will our buildings stay watertight, but some of the flooding we were seeing in CLC classrooms will no longer be a problem; of course, we have to have rain to make sure, so only time will tell on that one. We also started and have almost completed remodeling the restrooms in the sanctuary to make them more accessible—as our congregation ages, and we are seeing more wheelchairs and walkers show up on Sunday mornings, it's a critical and longneeded change. We're also finishing up designs for in the south education building inaccessible new signage throughout campus—hopefully we will see those installed before the end of the year.

Our big events continue to draw thousands of Midland families. This year we hosted Trunk-rtreat on the east side of campus, and I'm glad we did—if we were on the west side of campus we would have been shoulder-to-shoulder. As it was. families were able to spread out and enjoy the seasons fun and our beautiful front yard. Our best guess is that over 1000, up to 1500, children and families came out to enjoy that event. And, as always, our Easter Eggstravaganza in Hill Park was huge success. Again, thousands of locals enjoyed the beautiful day in the park.

Next year, I look forward to challenging us in an important way—starting in January we're going to read through the entire Bible in a year. There will be more information forthcoming in December. This will require daily reading schedule and the program we're using includes some nice video content to help explain the background of the books of the Bible and a deeper dive into some topics—I've used some of this video content with my Sunday School class and they've always given it high marks.

Looking forward I also see renovation projects to make other areas of the campus more accessible, as well as more beautiful. We have a courtyard space that would be ideal, but we can't get anything to grow there, and the sidewalks surrounding need to be redesigned; many rooms unless you have two really good, working legs. On the east side of campus, adjacent to the church offices, the parking and walkways are downright



treacherous. And our empty garden beds around campus have been an eyesore for some time. I hope we can address all of these issues in the coming year—we will schedule a town hall meeting to discuss our priorities once we get through the holiday season.

All this is to say that your financial support of our congregation has been an important part of all our successes this past year, and I ask for you to prayerfully reflect on the role that financial

stewardship plays in discipleship. Your faithfulness is an important part of how we continue to share and live out the good news of Jesus Christ.
