THINGS THEY DIDN'T TEACH ME IN SEMINARY

It's a common refrain amongst ministers: "Why didn't they teach this in

seminary?" In ministry we often find ourselves spending a lot of energy doing things that we didn't study at the graduate level. We train to do advanced exegesis of ancient texts--we spend a lot of time trying to exegete instruction manuals for office equipment. We study methods in preaching and pastoral counseling--we spend a lot of time fencing with HVAC systems and diagnosing plumbing issues.

I remember my mom feeling a little anxious about my future: "I don't want you to grow up to be a jack-of-all-trades and master of none."

Growing up...well still today...I have a tendency to be a hobbyist. Growing up I was constantly picking up new interests. I had a black-and-white (and eventually color) photography darkroom in my basement when I was in junior high. It started with my mother's lucrative purchase of darkroom equipment at a garage sale and mushroomed into a pastime that took over half of my mom's basement laundry room. That launched me into a lucrative career as photographer for my highschool and college, but then I went to seminary to study more important things, the darkroom equipment was sold off or given away, and my camera and lenses went into the closet. After all that experience, I wondered what that was all about.

I remember my mom feeling a little anxious about my future. I remember her making the comment, "I don't want you to grow up to be a jack-of-alltrades and master of none." I was quick to pick up new hobbies, run with them for a while, but never developed a laser sharp focus on anything in particular. I remember another time that she was concerned that I wasn't spending enough time in Bible study while in Bible College. I'll admit that there are any number of folks who know more Bible than I do, but I think I've made up for that one. But I do have to grant that I tend to bounce from one thing to another--what good can come of that?

Years later, I'm in my second ministry, and I find a forgotten interest re-emerging. By the mid-2000's digital photography has replaced traditional photography, and suddenly you don't need an entire room to create beautiful photographs. That blossomed into some creative art I created for my church and eventually became an important part of the project I did for my Doctor of Ministry degree at Drew University. Though there were no Seminary Classes on photography and visual arts, and I'm sure most of my Bible professors would have poo-pooed the idea, somehow God found a way to use that skill that I had put on the back burner decades before.

Some folks have been asking me about how long I've been playing guitar. Though I started when I was a teenager, but like so many other interests, there have been long stretches of times, as long as a decade, that I didn't pick up a guitar. And the strange thing is, even after laying off for quite a while, as soon as I pick it up, the muscle-memory that I developed as a teen comes back and I form familiar chords like I had only taken a week off.

I attended seminary at Abilene Christian University, and for obvious reasons that did not offer a class on leading worship with guitar accompaniment--the Church of Christ is a non-



instrumental movement after all. Though that didn't teach me that in seminary, for some reason I hear God calling me to reach back into those stowed resources for the benefit of His people.

As a minister, and as a Christian, that's often when I feel like I'm giving my all for God. When I can share traditional resources like Biblical preaching and teaching, but also share myself, that's when I feel like I'm loving God with all that I am. In your walk and in your desire to give your all for God, what experiences do you call upon to share God's love with others?
