

I DID IT! NOW WHAT?

I remember my high school graduation well. I was glad to be out of school, but I wasn't clear on where I was heading.

I think I submitted enrollment to Wichita State University for the Fall of that year, and I thought that I might go into the engineering program. But to be honest, I wasn't sure that was a good fit for me.

Not long after graduation my oldest sister and brother-in-law came to visit my family in Wichita. It had been a couple of years since we had been together, and I guess in those years I had matured enough that they actually liked being around me; I had a tendency toward moodiness as a teen and I guess I "came out of my shell" that year.

They asked me about my college plans; I assumed that I needed to stay close to home to start college. Since I was a little directionless at the time, I wasn't looking at anything out of state. Out of the blue, my brother-in-law, after talking privately with my parents, asked if I would be interested in going to the Bible College in eastern Kentucky where he was a professor; they even offered for me to live with them to save on dormitory costs. At the time I didn't think there was a possibility for me to embark on such an adventure. But that generous offer has forever changed the direction of my life.

I'm excited for the futures of our graduates, and I look forward to how God will shape their futures.
